
The drive aims to collect and distribute blankets to the needy in the greater Northcliff area and has been extended for the month of June.

The Tshepo Community Development Initiative runs an aftercare centre for latchkey children in Windsor and were happy to receive 38 blankets. Social worker Theki Phukuntsi thanked the Blanket Drive partners and those who donated. "In a dwelling which is not well insulated, a blanket like this makes it possible for people to sleep warm – this is a wonderful gift."

Northcliff Union Church's senior pastor responsible for the blanket allocation, Gavin Wood, said that they are vetting a number of additional potential charities to receive the blankets which are still coming in, and will ensure that all donated blankets are given to meet genuine needs.
